

Every young woman who walks into First Choice for Women is unique and has hopes, dreams and challenges exclusive to her. Many come to us heartbroken over an unplanned pregnancy; others are disappointed when the pregnancy test is negative. Although their circumstances are different, one key factor will often make the difference between an abortion decision and a LIFE decision...family support.



Kat,* 21 years old, came to us for a pregnancy test, accompanied by her adoptive mother, Betsy Wright.* Kat was emotionally distraught and explained that she has experienced a lot of trauma and loss in her young life. She has joint custody of a young son, but, other than her child, she has no one. Then she met the Wright family at church. Seeing Kat's need for love and a family, they felt God leading them to adopt her in April, even though she was legally an adult. And now, Betsy was here, sitting beside Kat in the counseling room, holding her hand.

When the pregnancy test was positive, Kat completely broke down. "I can't have this baby. I can't do this again. This can't happen!" Betsy just calmly replied, "We'll figure it out." The staff and volunteers of First Choice also assured Kat of their support and offered her an ultrasound appointment. Kat left the center still very upset but planning to return for the sonogram. When she came back, with Betsy at her side, Kat shared that, with the support of her family, she had decided to continue the pregnancy. Instead of being desperate and frightened, Kat was now glowing and embracing the new life growing inside her.

Had it not been for the steadfast, loving support of this adoptive family, Kat's story might have had a very different ending...one with post-abortion regret to add to her already traumatic past. Please pray for the many clients we see that *do not* have a family like Kat's. Pray for the staff and volunteers of First Choice for Women as we share the hope found in a heavenly Father who will never leave or forsake them.

Hello and Goodbye

Usually, the first newsletter of the year contains statistics, numbers that show what happened during the year just completed. It won't surprise anyone that COVID impacted our outreach in 2020. But even though there was a 50% drop in the numbers, we still had 1,509 participants. Of those 1,509 students, 86% of them chose to be abstinent from sexual activity. As in past years, these students gained 10% more knowledge about healthy relationships, too. Success is not measured in numbers alone, but it is good to remember that the numbers represent people God loves very much.



When I realized we would not be finishing the school year the way we began it, I spent my time at the center doing whatever needed to be done. My tasks included chaperoning for ultrasounds, answering the phone and making appointments, providing options counseling for pregnancy tests, mentoring in parent care, cleaning, reorganizing, changing the message on the sign, learning to ZOOM and then ZOOMing, picking up trash and weeding, AND staying in contact with health teachers to provide e-lessons. When the fall semester started in August, we were ready to either go into the schools or drop off the materials they would need to lead abstinence lessons on their own. We established a rhythm and finished the year better than we started it. Except for one little bump in the road...

...I am leaving – not just my wonderful position at First Choice but leaving Muncie, leaving Indiana, and heading West. Fred and I have spent nearly all our lives here in Blackford and Delaware Counties. But we've decided that now is the time to do something different and see where God leads us. We are excited...nervous and a little sad...but mostly excited!

My years at First Choice have been the best work experience of my life. The stories I can tell would fill a small book. The slang I've learned from students has been eye-opening and fun. My heart has hurt many times when kids have talked about their families, but I've also laughed so hard with them and have enjoyed the time I've spent with them. More than anything, I hope I gave them some of myself and encouraged them to make healthy choices in an unhealthy world. Communicating with teachers about my departure has been so bittersweet! Friendships with First Choice coworkers has been a bonus. We have become a family that loves to serve Jesus in partnership. I have no doubt that the FCFW team will move forward into areas we haven't tackled yet. God has put the right people in the right places for the next season. I am so grateful that I got to be part of what has already been established.

Union Chapel

Our Church Spotlight for this quarter shines on Union Chapel Ministries, located at 4622 N. Broadway Ave. in Muncie. Gregg Parris has served as the lead pastor for forty years and continues to see God's favor.

With a congregation of approximately 1,300, Union Chapel offers three Sunday services at 8:30, 10:00 and 11:30am, as well as a wide variety of ministries and connection points for all ages.

"The church is not defined as a building, but rather by lives committed to loving God and serving people in our community," notes Executive Director Candace Ford.

The mission of Union Chapel is defined as UC3, to "Know, Grow, Go," believing that you get the most out of life by knowing God, growing in relationship with God and others, and going to serve others to make a difference. This mission results in a multifaceted approach to ministry. One of their newest outreach efforts is a men's recovery home. Partnering with Dr. Draper and Urban Light Ministries, they plan to help fill the gap between treatment and full recovery, aiming to meet the needs of men struggling to transition from addiction to new life.

Another program that will make a great impact on the community is BU@UC, a faith-based college extension program, offering fully accredited associate and bachelor level degrees in partnership with Bethel University. At a fraction of the cost of traditional faith-based college tuition, students will receive practical experience in a strong academic environment that promotes spiritual growth.







Union Chapel is known throughout Delaware County for its annual SERVE week event. "For nearly 20 years, SERVE has been a practical way for our congregation to work together to carry out our mission and vision to go and serve in our community," notes Candace. First Choice has benefited from this wonderful outreach program. SERVE teams have worked at First Choice each summer sorting clothes, cleaning, and more. Additionally, leading up to SERVE week, church members have donated more than 75 bags of diapers and other baby supplies for our clients.

First Choice is also blessed to have several UC members as volunteers. Lisa Cochran, RN, is one of our nurse sonographers.

"I'm thankful that my church supports this life affirming ministry. They see the need to walk alongside women who are facing literal life and death decisions. I love serving at First Choice. We meet our clients at the point of their need. Our staff and volunteers greet all with open arms and the grace found in Jesus Christ."
