Welcoming in the new year of 2023 reminded me of a time I was trying to walk to my mailbox on ice. I could not seem to keep my footing and felt the cold ice more than I felt like I was set and steady. One may ask "why didn't you just give up and turn around?" But I persevered and kept pressing toward the goal. Do you ever feel like turning around and giving up?

To be utterly transparent, I had moments that I would question the plans for our Fatherhood Initiative. We had two solid volunteers and one fatherhood champion when we first began this path. One of our volunteers continued to spread the news that we were mentoring dads and that we needed fathers who would come alongside these men and empower and equip them to be what God had called them to be as dads. Men of all parenting ages, including grandparents, were coming through our doors and yet no fathers

were signing up to mentor them. The news was spreading but the fire was not kindled in the way we desired.

Last year we received our first Fatherhood Grant through our affiliate, Carenet. It was an amazing opportunity that led to father focused material for our clients, a few more interested men to volunteer and our Fatherhood Administrator. We leaped from well under 80 male client visits in 2021 to well over 600 male client visits in 2022. God moved in amazing ways throughout last year. We were down to two volunteers and a few in training at the end of 2022. Applying for the Fatherhood grant another time, we were elated to hear over Christmas break that we were one of the 20 recipients for the 2023 Fatherhood Grant.

The first few weeks back to work were the ice trip to the mailbox design. Then on January 21, I was met with an unexpected God wink. Walking into the training room for the beginning of our training for 2023, I walked in to greet 6 men! Never before have we had a group of all men sitting in a training! Glory to God!!! Hello?!!

So here we are, entering 2023, with 14 men! A mixture of men fully trained and in training. We also are sending four Pastors and 2 laymen, for the first time, to the Carenet Men's Summit, where they will be empowered to turn their passion into action, be inspired by great speakers and become a part of First Choice's story in a historical fashion! You may be asking, "What does that have to do with the verse above and your story about ice and a mailbox?" If I am to take any nugget from this current season and apply it to my memory box for repeated use, it is:

- 1. Be steadfast: Paul wants them to be faithful to the Lord and to his teaching about the Lord, to keep going.
- 2. Be immovable: Paul is very concerned about the Corinthians' tendency to compromise their behavior and even their beliefs for the sake of the culture in which they live
- 3. Be always abounding in the work of the Lord knowing that your work is not in vain: Paul has been clear that God gives each believer ways in which to serve Him, by serving each other in the church. The Corinthians should be doing so with enthusiasm. This work they do for the Lord is guaranteed to continue to matter for eternity, compared to so much of life that will cease to have meaning in years, days, or even minutes.

I had the privilege to meet one of our clients and hear him say, "you guys include me too! I'm not just the mom's assistant, I'm actually the dad and considered part of the team!"

"It can't happen without men stepping into this role to protect the vulnerable, as Roland Warren says. That's what Kingdom men do." Thank you for being those men!

### **Surrendering The Secret**

Millions of women and men carry the pain and heartache of a previous abortion. They hide their secret deep in their hearts, and many are suffering severe consequences. We can NO LONGER ignore this vast mission field. With compassion, we must show these women and men how to replace the enemies' lies with God's truths and lead them to healing and freedom.

Forty-three percent of women have had at least one abortion by the time they are forty-three years old. That is approximately one in three. Seventy-nine percent of this number claim to be Christians. To put this into perspective, take the number of women in a church and divide it by three. That will give you the approximate number of women in that church congregation who daily carry the burden of least one past abortion. These are numbers from just a church population. Think how many we would add if we considered the community as a whole.

First Choice for Women can help reach this mission field with compassion, love, truth and hope. Surrendering the Secret is a biblically-based healing journey for men and women that have experienced the pain of abortion. It is an eight-week Bible study that will help participants find hope and healing through unique journaling exercises and meaningful group activities in a caring, confidential community. I have been trained by Pat Layton and her team of national trainers to lead this Bible study and break the silence of the pain of abortion. We are prayerfully waiting for a man to lead our men through this program.

### **Creating Positive Relationships**

In 2022, our Creating Positive Relationships educational program thrived! Our instructors had the privilege of speaking to 3,450 students across Madison, Delaware, and Grant counties. Seventy-nine percent of the students who took our anonymous survey said they are going to choose abstinence.

Here are some comments that students made after having one of our guest speakers in class:

I learned a ton of new stuff this week. Even though I was choosing to be abstinent and not have sex before marriage, I feel even more strongly about that decision. I also learned what certain STI's were and how they can affect me. I feel like my instructor did a very good job at teaching this to me and my class. I learned quite a lot, and I honestly think that she is one of my favorite guest speakers. She was very informative about this topic.

I learned a lot this week about relationships, and I started to talk to my mom more. Now we have a bond because of this week. The instructor was great. I have learned a lot from her!"

I learned this week to set boundaries with anyone I start dating, and that you HAVE to talk with your parents. I think [the instructor] did good because I wouldn't find out these things that help keep me from danger. She was really nice and caring. I think your program is going to help children and teenagers and maybe even adults.

I learned a lot more than I thought I would. I've learned you can get a lot of diseases, and I think a lot of people would've changed their minds if they knew about those diseases. The instructor did really good! I think the program is a good thing for high school students. People should learn about these topics because it's sure changed my thinking about a lot!

Most of my relationships didn't go as planned. Most of them used me. I couldn't do anything about it because I've never really seen any red flags. As we learned about all of this in class, I've noticed that there were many red flags. This could really help me in the future.

We've all heard the adage, "Many hands make light work." I have found this true in life and true in the ministry of First Choice for Women. Partnering with other Delaware County agencies has allowed us to have a greater reach and to better serve the clients who need our assistance.

One example of this is our partnership with The Family Resource Center, which recently celebrated its second anniversary in Delaware County. Located on Walnut Street, this organization serves to connect agencies with those who need community resources. First Choice has a presence there as part of their "Full House Chat" parenting support group. I participate in a monthly online meeting to assess community needs and brainstorm solutions. I serve as the community connector for this group, receiving information about community happenings and then forwarding it to a large group of agency representatives through email.

We recently experienced the benefit that results from these connections. A local teacher reached out for help for a student about to deliver twins. We were able to provide newborn necessities and information about First Choice programs to this caring teacher. The teacher was so appreciative and said, "I knew who to call," because she receives community emails from me.

We also received a phone call recently from Firefly Children and Family Alliance. They were looking for a very hard-to-find formula for a baby about to be released from Riley Children's Hospital. It was nowhere to be found on the shelves of local retailers, but we had it a First Choice! God had already provided for that sweet baby. Someone had donated that formula to First Choice, and we had it when it was needed.

Agencies such as A Better Way, Muncie Mission, Healthy Families, and many more are working together to make Delaware County a safe place for families. Another familiar adage says, "Teamwork makes the dream work." First Choice is honored to be part of the team.

We adore our church partners here at First Choice, and we are celebrating Tabor Church, a long-time supporter that is near and dear to our hearts. # KROGER COMMUNITY REWARDS PROGRAM

To designate First Choice for Women as your charity of choice in the Kroger Community Rewards Program visit the website, set up an account and enter DW443 or UU404 when it asks you to enter a "NPO#"



(non profit organization). When shopping at Kroger and using your Kroger Plus Card, you can give to First Choice. This program allows Kroger Plus members to designate First Choice to receive a percentage of what they spend at Kroger.

#### **MAKING A QCD**

Over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, and interested in potentially reducing your income taxes??? Please discuss with your CPA/ tax preparer if using the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) would be beneficial to you. Upon reaching age 70 1/2, account holders of Traditional Retirement Accounts (IRA, 403b, 401K, etc.) must take an annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from the account. The IRS permits the account holder to send the RMD (or more up to \$100,000) directly from the Traditional IRA only, to a 501(c)(3) as a QCD and therefore not have to include the withdrawal as taxable income. With the 2018 tax law changes that increase the Standard Deduction, many people will no longer itemize and therefore get no tax benefit from making charitable contributions. Utilizing the QCD allows people to continue to make contributions and eliminate those gifts from taxable income. Please discuss this strategy with your CPA/tax preparer if you are over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, and are interested in reducing your income taxes.
