- 6. Last but not least, I recently re-read a vital book for all Christians. Its title is Abortion // A Rational Look at an Emotional Issue, by R.C. Sproul, NavPress, 1990. Although it was written 30 years ago, its message is relevant for our time and this culture. It is logical and objective. Scripture quotations included in this article are from the English Standard Translation. Many of the ideas, while not quoted, are taken from this book. There are a few quotes, which are cited.

For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well.

My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them. (Ps. 139:13–16)

This passage reminds us that God is active in the womb of a mother, and He intimately knows the child that He has created.

(Interestingly, the Hebrew word translated as "unformed substance" is the Hebrew word for "embryo," and this is the only instance of that word in the Bible.)

"Listen to me, O coastlands, and give attention, you peoples from afar. The LORD called me from the womb, from the body of my mother he named my name. (Isa. 49:1)

Human beings are not accidents.

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." (Jer. 1:4–5)

He set apart or sanctified Jeremiah before birth and called him to be a prophet to nations.

Every day, we have women and men come through our doors who may know these truths, but feel hopeless and that their situation is hopeless. Some do not know these truths.

Our job is to lead them with the love of Christ, being truthful and compassionate. Our job is to offer hope and practical solutions.

Our job is not to change or enforce laws.

Our job is not to guilt, coerce, or preach to them.

Our job is to be bold enough to advocate for life in every situation. Our job is not to fear those who believe differently, but to pray for them.

Dear and Holy Father,

We are in awe that we humans were Your idea. In Your incredible wisdom and creativity, You not only thought of us, You made us, and said it was good. And so, we agree that we humans are important to You. It is an honor to serve You and do Your will.

May we always work toward the goals that You have laid out for us. We honor You Lord, the author and creator of life. Thank you for the blessing we receive when we do Your will. Fatherhood Initiative

A full year has come and gone since we learned the news that First Choice for Women was selected from among ninety-seven applicants by Care Net to be a part of the Fatherhood pilot project. The staff quickly assessed both centers, making changes and adaptations that would make men welcome. Our social media accounts began to frequently message "Fathers Welcome!" and the reception desk volunteers added a new question when making appointments, "Who will you be bringing with you?" The addition of this simple question began many conversations that allowed us to welcome fathers and has led to a thirty percent increase in consistent service to men in our centers during the project year. These men are accompanying their partners to pregnancy test and ultrasound appointments, engaging in Parent Care sessions, and joining

with other men in Dr. Dad group workshops, gaining practical knowledge about caring for their young children and being supported spiritually by our volunteers.

I came on staff in early June, nine months into the project, and have spent time learning, observing, and getting to know the volunteers and the unique culture of each of our centers. In August, I went to the Care Net National Conference — attended fatherhood sessions, connected with other fatherhood program leaders, and, most importantly, sought wisdom and direction for the Fatherhood Initiative at the feet of our mighty God! The verse that emerged from the conference and encompasses my vision for growing this project comes from Jeremiah 29:7 (ESV) and has long been my heart for our community. "But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile," (as an expat from the great state of Texas, the 'exile' part makes me smile), "and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare." I am praying and diligently searching for twelve men in the coming year to serve in each center so that any time a man enters our doors, he will be welcomed by a familiar face. Will you commit to praying with me to reach this goal? When we champion and support fathers, we support mothers, children, and families, and this can create life-altering, lifesaving, and life-flourishing results for our community.

One Woman Shares Her Experience with the Abortion Reversal Pill

It was a typical day at First Choice for Women when Katie* came into the office with her boyfriend. She was requesting a pregnancy test. Her test was positive, and they were likely to carry. No red flags. They were looking forward to coming back for the ultrasound appointment.

Two days later, she called the office, asking to speak with me. She asked me about abortion procedures. Since we had already built a relationship during her first appointment, she trusted me when I asked her to come into the office so I could speak to her. She came in just hours later with her father. The situation with her boyfriend, father of the baby, had

changed. I spoke truth to her that day and also gave her hope. We went over all our information, even the pamphlet about the new abortion reversal pill that we had just recently received. Katie left that day knowing that she was cared about and that I had spoken truth about all her options.

A few days later, I decided to send her a text message to check on her. She advised me that she had a date for her abortion. My response was, "I know this is very hard, Katie. We are here for you if you need someone to talk to and to process your feelings. Please let me know if you would like to come in and talk again." I never heard back from her.

On the day of the procedure, I sent her another text, just letting her know that she was in my thoughts and that I was praying for her. I told her what I had before: "God has a plan. We don't know why things are happening the way they are, but God does, and we are here for you." Again, I never heard from her.

But God! I was sitting at my son's baseball game when my phone dinged. It was Katie. Her words were, "I couldn't go through with it. I took the first pill and instantly regretted it. In a moment of panic, I realized that it was really my life versus my unborn child's life, and I was choosing abortion because I felt like that was the best quick fix. But I no longer felt relief. I felt guilt and trauma, and I was so very sad and remorseful. I was deeply regretting my decision to have an abortion. Then I remembered you! You gave me information on the abortion reversal pill, and I had that folder in my car! I immediately called the hotline, and they got me to a physician right away."

Now, Katie is almost due and carrying a beautiful, healthy baby boy. First Choice was there to provide the tangible information requested and to show her unconditional love and compassion. A seed was planted at that first visit. We talk almost weekly, and she is attending a church in her hometown. She and the father of the baby are working on their relationship.

My last message from her stated, "People who want to walk this journey with you are not on every street corner, but you meant it when you told me that you weren't going anywhere, no matter what. Now, every day, I will be able to look at my son, knowing, and fully knowing, that he is a miracle and a fighter. I can do this! I am just so grateful that I never have to wonder who he would've been, and instead, I get to watch his little life unfold right before my eyes."

In the past few months, our country has been facing a formula shortage that has affected so many families. We have seen fear and desperation in the faces of clients who have searched everywhere for the specific formula their baby needs. How does a family care for their child when they can't get the necessary supplies? How do they find the loving care and encouragement they need? They come to First Choice. And by meeting a client's material needs, we often have the opportunity to minister to them on a deeper level.

One day, a group of six people walked into the center: a couple with a baby in a carrier, a 17-year-old girl wanting a pregnancy test, her boyfriend, and her mother. The couple with the baby said that they had been here before for a pregnancy test and an ultrasound, so when their friend needed services, they knew where to take her. We reminded them about all of our support services to families. Then the couple heard a woman at the front desk getting formula. They asked, "Do you have formula? Gerber?" When we told them we did, they looked at each other, and the girl teared up. She could not find formula anywhere and was giving the baby applesauce in a bottle! We were able to give her two cans. When she gave us her name to make a ParentCare appointment, we realized that she had been an abortion vulnerable client in 2021, but we had never been able to reach her to find out her pregnancy decision. When we mentioned that we remembered her, she started to cry, "I can't believe that I ever considered aborting my baby." We comforted her and reminded her that all that was in the past. She had made the right decision, and we were thrilled to see her again and to meet her baby!

What a great day! Praise God for His provision of her material needs and the opportunity we had to comfort her. Thank you for your continued support that makes these life-impacting experiences possible.

Creating Positive Relationships

Talking to your kids about relationships and sex can be so difficult. Many parents avoid it or procrastinate because they don't feel comfortable discussing these subjects. This year, our Healthy Relationship Education program is adding a new approach to teaching healthy relationships and abstinence education.

- 87% of teens aged 12-19 say that it would be much easier for teens to delay sexual activity and avoid teen pregnancy if they were able to have more open, honest conversations about these topics with their parents (The National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy, With One Voice).
- 46% of teens 12-19 say that parents most influence their decision about sex. By comparison, 20% say friends most influence their decisions (The National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy).
- Almost one-third of teens aged 12-17 say the conversation should start even earlier – at age 12 or younger (The National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy (2007). Kiss & Tell: What Teens Say about Love, Trust and Other Relationship Stuff).

We passionately desire to empower parents to talk to their kids about hard things. We are now offering a free education program to churches and Christian schools to encourage and help parents and youth leaders communicate with their children and teens in a healthy and productive way. Our parent guide will be given to each parent who attends the session.



ESTATE GIFT (IN YOUR WILL)

The most popular way of providing long-term support for a meaningful charitable organization is to make a gift in a will. With some foresight, you can make a gift in your will that fulfills specific planning goals as an integral part of an estate plan.

MAKING A QCD

Over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, and interested in potentially reducing your income taxes??? Please discuss with your CPA/ tax preparer if using the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) would be beneficial to you. Upon reaching age 70 1/2, account holders of Traditional Retirement Accounts (IRA, 403b, 401K, etc.) must take an annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from the account. The IRS permits the account holder to send the RMD (or more up to \$100,000) directly from the Traditional IRA only, to a 501(c)(3) as a QCD and therefore not have to include the withdrawal as taxable income. With the 2018 tax law changes that increase the Standard Deduction, many people will no longer itemize and therefore get no tax benefit from making charitable contributions. Utilizing the QCD allows people to continue to make contributions and eliminate those gifts from taxable income. Please discuss this strategy with your CPA/tax preparer if you are over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, and are interested in reducing your income taxes.
