

What's a Dad Got to do with It?

Since most First Choice clients are women, pregnancy care center staff and volunteers often wondered or perhaps even ask, "Will the father of the baby be coming with you to your appointment?"

Men are frequently ignored in the conversation about pregnancy, abortion, adoption, and parenting. Yet the thoughts of the baby's father or the mother's feelings about him can be the most important factor in a woman's pregnancy decision. Some women will go through an unwanted abortion in order to avoid losing a relationship with a man they love. Other women will choose abortion rather than consider the possibility that a man they distrust would ever gain custody of their child. Women who feel secure in their relationship with their partner and who know that he wants the baby are more likely to carry to term.

In 2020, the staff of First Choice for Women attended the CareNet conference. This is where we heard the words, "Joseph held the Baby too." Lightbulb moment! That was when we knew that we were missing the mark and needed to advocate for the fathers more. In 2021, First Choice applied for a Fatherhood grant through CareNet, and we won! It was an amazing experience to be announced at the CareNet conference.

Fast forward to now. We have been working diligently with CareNet's Fatherhood team to implement our own Fatherhood Initiative here at First Choice. We held our first Dr. Dad workshop in Madison County in January. It was led by our Fatherhood Champion, Todd Lail. It was great to see two fathers say, "Yes I'll come" without hesitation. These classes are for expectant fathers and will help increase their health literacy by providing them with the knowledge and skills they need to successfully care for their young children.

In our culture, it's hard for a man to say he needs help raising his children. We have a great motto that states, "No one can teach a man to be a man better than a man." We pray that we will be the father's "First Choice" when it comes to his discussions regarding parenting from here on out.

We can't wait to watch this program bloom into what God has planned for it!

Hope and a Future

Every client who comes to First Choice has unique personalities, life circumstances, and challenges. That's why it is imperative that we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us as we speak with clients about pregnancy choices. We never know what the Lord will use to soften someone's heart.

Cheryl* and Donovan* came to us, saying that they absolutely could not parent another child. They already needed Cheryl's parents to help with two children they have, the youngest being ten months old. Cheryl was dealing with multiple life challenges, including drug addiction issues, and was seriously considering abortion. Donovan did not want the abortion but said he would support whatever decision she made. This is what we often hear from the father of the baby. He doesn't feel empowered to share his true feelings about the pregnancy. Unfortunately, disagreement about the decision can lead to lifelong emotional issues and will often result in the deterioration of the relationship. We discussed adoption in view of the hope and future for the baby, as well as the potential effect of this single baby's life on future generations. They made an ultrasound appointment and said, "You've given us a lot to think about."

When they returned for the sonogram, Cheryl said they had chosen to carry the baby to term because the thought of "the hope and future of the baby and future generations" really stuck with them. Watching the baby's movements on the ultrasound monitor sealed their decision. They are now attending ParentCare classes, and we are connecting Donovan with a fatherhood mentor.

We are so thankful for this baby's life and the opportunity to work with this family as they navigate the multiple challenges they face. It reminds us of how God meets us at the unique point of our need every day, as it says in Psalm 34:4, I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears. Praise His Name!





You can also get a Choose Life license plate at your local BMV. Every year your plate is registered, \$25 will go toward the pregnancy resource center in your county.

ESTATE GIFT (IN YOUR WILL)

The most popular way of providing long-term support for a meaningful charitable organization is to make a gift in a will. With some foresight, you can make a gift in your will that fulfills specific planning goals as an integral part of an estate plan.

MAKING A QCD

Over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, interested in potentially reducing your income taxes??? Please discuss with your CPA/tax preparer if using the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) would be beneficial to you. Upon reaching age 70 1/2, account holders of Traditional Retirement Accounts (IRA, 403b, 401K, etc.) must take an annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from the account. The IRS permits the account holder to send the RMD (or more up to \$100,000) directly from the Traditional IRA only, to a 501(c)(3) as a QCD and therefore not have to include the withdrawal as taxable income. With the 2018 tax law changes that increase the Standard Deduction, many people will no longer itemize and therefore get no tax benefit from making charitable contributions. Utilizing the QCD allows people to continue to make contributions and eliminate those gifts from taxable income. Please discuss this strategy with your CPA/tax preparer if you are over age 70 1/2, have Traditional IRAs, and are interested in reducing your income taxes.
